1)	<p><u>INTRODUCTIONS</u> Terri Pepperday was introduced.</p>	(C.)
2)	<p><u>APOLOGISE</u> Apologies were received from the following: - Cllr. Bill Drewitt, Jason Bennett, Cllr. Steve Garber, Kevin and Cherie Mason</p>	(C.)
3)	<p><u>MINUTES FROM LAST MEETING & MATTERS ARISING</u> Minutes for the meeting held on 22nd October 2007 were distributed and agreed as a true record.</p> <p><u>Bolsover and Montague Streets</u> - Ian gave an update with regards to his enquiries at Land Registry. Further investigations were required. (Ian to action)</p> <p><u>Asquith School</u> – No one attended due to late notification.</p> <p><u>Garages on Scarcliffe Street</u> – Several E-Mails had been sent to MDC regarding this problem. As Cllr Drewitt was not at the meeting an update could not be given. It was suggested that Cllr Drewitt raised this issue at the next Full Council Meeting and that if/when demolition was not likely to take place within the next 12 months then rents should be waived.</p>	(C.)
4)	<p><u>CORRESPONDENCE</u> The Temporary Gates for the Racecourse Park had been delivered today.</p>	
5)	<p><u>FUNDING AND GRANTS UPDATE</u> Ian informed the meeting he was awaiting the arrival of 50,000 bags for distribution and also 5,000 leaflets and 5,000 cards for the Dog Leash bags were being distributed in the Neighbourhood Newsletter, which informed where collections for bags can be made. Newgate Lane and Gordon Avenue are still experiencing problems with mess.</p>	

6) **WARDENS/POLICING UPDATE**

Neighbourhoods are to be clustered and Alan Lloyd will be organising workshops to look at proposals for the changes in March. Damage to vehicles on Smith Street had now been resolved. It had been reported that young ones were now gathering on Southwell Road near the Post Office and if they persisted then letters were going to be sent to parents. The committee suggested that they promote the Youth Club, which had internal activities. It was also hoped that Sherwood Hall Academy would be arranging After School Clubs. It was also reported that the Co-op on Carter Lane had had a robbery and it had been suggested to them that a security be employed for protection.
